TERMS YOU SHOULD KNOW



PRENUPTIAL AGREEMENT

A contract signed by two people before marriage that defines how assets, debts, and other financial matters will be handled during marriage and in the event of divorce or death. This can often be referred to as a premarital agreement or prenup.



SEPARATE PROPERTY

Property owned by one spouse before the marriage or received individually through gift, inheritance, or certain personal injury settlements.



WAIVER

A voluntary relinquishment of a known right (e.g., waiving spousal support).



WAIVER OF DISCLOSURE OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION

A document in which each person affirms they received a copy of the prenuptial agreement, they have been provided a fair and reasonable disclosure of the property and financial obligations of the other party, and they waive the right to any further disclosure or opportunity investigate.



VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT

A contract signed freely without coercion, fraud, or duress.



COMMUNITY PROPERTY

All property acquired during the marriage (unless proven to be separate property).



SPOUSAL SUPPORT (ALIMONY)

Payments made by one spouse to the other after divorce, as outlined in the agreement or court order.



FAIR AND REASONABLE DISCLOSURE

The process of fully revealing each person's financial information before signing the prenuptial agreement.



REPRESENTATION

Legal counsel for each party ensures understanding and fairness of the prenuptial agreement. This helps ensure the agreement's validity.



UNCONSCIONABILITY

A legal term describing an agreement that is grossly unfair or one-sided. If both parties have legal representation, it is harder to argue the agreement was unconscionable.
